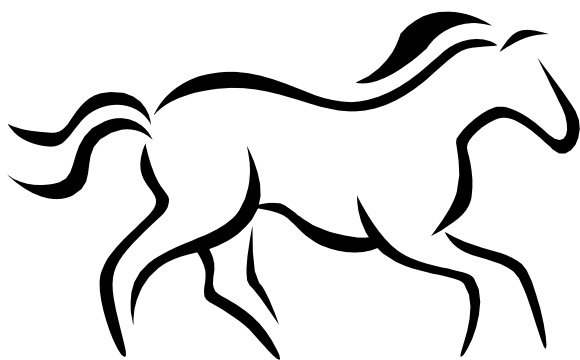


You are Invited to Attend Huntington's Horse-O-Rama
